### GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD

John the Beloved records these marvelous words, *“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.”* (Jn.3:16)

When did God give His Son? We may believe that it was when Jesus Christ was born in the womb of Mary or else when He was crucified on Calvary. However the Scripture tells us that the Lamb was slain from the foundation of the world. (Rev.13: 8)

We may have thought that this meant that “positionally,” Jesus had been slain at the beginning but as we lean upon our Lord's bosom and listen to His Word of life we learn that the Lamb was indeed actually given to be slain before the world of the Adam man began. With that in mind let us look at what the Spirit wants to reveal today.

God created the heavens and the earth and all the host of them. In six biblical days (which could well be eons of years) God put together His unsearchable universe. And He loved it. He saw that it was very good and He was very pleased with all of it.

When God had finished we read, *“And God saw every thing that he had made, and, behold, it was VERY GOOD. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day.”*(Gen.1: 31) Besides the cosmos as we know them, God also created a man on the sixth day. *“And God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.*

*And God blessed them and said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and REPLENISH THE EARTH, AND SUBDUE IT: and have dominion over the fish of the sea and the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.”* (Gen.1: 27-28)

Who was this man AFTER GOD'S OWN IMAGE? Who was this one who was given dominion over all that had life in the earth? Who was he who was called to SUBDUE all things that had life in the earth? To subdue means to “conquer and bring into subjection.” This man was not in the earth until God sent Him. And why did the earth need to be subdued? Was it in the state of chaos and disobedience?

We may have thought that this man was Adam the man of earth and blood but in reality Adam whose name means “Red” because he is from the ground, had not yet been formed. Would the enormous task of reproducing the image of God in the earth be given to the dusty man Adam or did the man after God's own image have much more to do with it?

When God commissions someone with a task, He first equips them and prepares them to accomplish that task. The man in God's own image was anointed for the task. The “anointing” that God gave him is called “Christ” and the man was sent into the earth as the Christ, the Anointed One.

Christ is the power, the anointing that the Son is given to reproduce His image in the earthly cre-

ation. This Son comes from the very loins of the Elohim God, He is the Son of God, the Lord God Almighty.

We might have thought that the Christ appeared in the earth when Jesus the Lord was born, but the Scriptures reveal that this “Christ” was all over the Old Testament as well. He was the Rock that followed them in the wilderness. He was the fire that did not consume the bush; Christ has been in this creation from its beginning.

He was the One of whom the prophet wrote, *“For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, the everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government there shall be no end...”* (Isa. 9: 6-7a)

God so loved that He gave this only begotten Son to bring His creation unto His own perfection. Then God had no more to do and He rested. *“Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And on the seventh day God ENDED HIS WORK which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made.”* (Gen.2: 1-2)

God has said, *“Let US make man”* and as “He,” the “Elohim” rested on the seventh day, the “Lord God” whose name is Jehovah-Elohim began His work in the earth. He is the One who is Lord of heaven and earth and He is part of the Elohim in the earth. He introduced Himself to Moses, saying, *“...I am the Lord: and I appeared unto Abraham, unto Isaac, and unto Jacob, by the name of God Almighty, but by my name Jehovah was I not known to them.”* (Ex.6: 2b-3)

When the Lord God appeared in the body of Jesus, He was the *“Brightness of the Father's glory and the EXPRESS IMAGE OF HIS PERSON”* (Heb.1: 3a), He declared to Philip, *“He that hath seen me, hath seen the Father.”* (Jn.14: 9b)

Generations had already gone by when Jehovah-Elohim the Lord God, began His work in the earth.

He found that everything that had life in the earth was growing lush and the ground was being refreshed continually by *“..a mist from the earth, that watered the whole face of the earth.”* (Vs.6) But *“There was not a man to till the ground.”* (Vs.5b)

The Son was still in the bosom of the Elohim the Father when this wonderful universe was created, and when it was finished; He rested. The Scripture is very clear about that. But the work that God had purposed and plan for His little blue planet had not yet begun. This mandate was given to the Son of God. He was the One called to multiply His image in the earth and to bring it under subjection.

The Son of God is the One whom the Father gave to do the work in the earth. He came in the beginning. The foundation of the world is the beginning of the Adam man's world. The Son is the beginner and the finisher of this work of faith. He is the Lord who is now waiting until all His enemies are made His footstool. He is the Son who was sent to bring all living things under the authority of God the Father.

In Genesis One we find God “The Elohim” calling His creation into being but in chapter two, we find The Lord God “Jehovah-Elohim” “The Self-Existent One” as He prepares to do the work of subduing the earth and forming His image into a man of earth.

He is the One who was commanded to subdue the earth; He is the Son of God who was later born from the womb of Mary. He is the One who promised Abraham a Seed to bless all the nations of the earth.

*“And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice.”* (Gen.22: 18) *“Now to Abraham and his seed were the promises made. He saith not, And to seeds, as of many; but as of one, And to thy seed; which is Christ.”* (Gal.3: 16)

This Christ is the Word of God and the Seed in His image. He is the Seed that the angel Gabriel announced when he told Joseph that Mary was with child from the Holy Ghost, *“...she shall bring forth*

*a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins.” (Matt.1: 21)*

The seventh day begins when the Lord God (Jehovah-Elohim) appears in the earth to begin His work. God has no beginning but the Lord God is the Beginning and the end of the creation of God in the earth. He is the Author and the Finisher, the Alpha and the Omega.

He has been in the earth to do this work from the beginning and will not end until He has put the last enemy under His feet and has turned the kingdom in its perfection over to the Father. The perfection that is ordained is its full potential or maturity which is the image of the Son.

This is the most poignant and beautiful love story that has ever been. It is the plan of Father and Son to bring the entire creation into their own image. What an enormous and magnificent work this is!! The Father gave His only begotten Son to bring His creation unto submission to the Father.

The Son has been multiplying His seed and is about to bring forth His first harvest (Firstfruits) as an offering to His Father and we find Him in Genesis chapter two as He appears in the earth. He is called “THE LORD GOD” for He is God, the Son of God. He began His work when He formed the man of earth and will end it when He presents the Father with this same man in His own image.

### **THE MAN OF DUST**

*“And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.” (Gen.2: 7)*

The Lord God imparted a breath of His own life into this earthly form and the mixture of the breath of life and the dust is called “a living soul.” It is a living earthly creature.

There were other living creatures in the earth at the time, but this one was designed to become a son of God in the flesh. *“But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name.” (Jn.1: 12)*

The breath of life is Spirit; man's life comes from Spirit. The man was able to hear the voice of the Lord God as He spoke with him in the garden. This means that he had ears to hear the voice coming from the Spirit within the garden of his soul (consciousness and understanding).

Man is a living being made up of Spirit, soul and body. Spirit is the part that is connected to God while soul expresses the Spirit through the body. Soul and body are tied to the earth. Spirit is the “male part” while “soul and body” are the female or earthly part. All three of these are necessary for the 'reproduction' of the image of God in the earth.

The Lord God then separated the male from the female. This was the next step in assuring the reproduction of the image. So He took the woman out of the man and He called her “woman” or the “womb part of the man.” She is the one who receives the seed of the man and nurtures it until it is formed into the same image.

We know this is true in the natural so we can apply it to what is happening in the Spirit as well. The Lord God formed the man of earth in order to bring forth many earthly bodies who would be the wombs that would bring forth the image of the heavenly or of Himself in the earth.

Paul says it like this, *“And as we have borne the image of the earthy, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly.” (I Cor. 15: 49)* Also *“Howbeit that was not first which is spiritual, but that which is natural; and afterward that which is spiritual.” (Vs.46)* The purpose of the earthly man is to give expression to the invisible Spirit within. This is called the “image” of the Son of God.

### **THE LORD GOD'S GARDEN**

*“And the Lord planted a garden Eastward in Eden; and there he put the man whom he had formed. And out of the ground made the Lord God to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight, and good for food; the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of knowledge of good and evil.” (Gen.2: 8-9)*

I believe that there is a literal garden of Eden. God provided a proper environment for His earthly creation. But to see and understand the full spiritual meaning of these verses, we must see that the Lord also provided his man with the inner garden of his soul and spirit.

There are many trees good for food and pleasant to the sight in this Eastward garden. East is where the light rises each day and this is the place that the Lord God has chosen to place the man that He has chosen.

The trees speak of the many resources that the Lord gave to feed man's spiritual and emotional needs. The soul in the Lord's garden is never bored or restless for there are all sorts of good things to partake of each day. Knowledge of God's creation is not evil; it is the **knowledge of good and evil that is deadly.**

Adam and Eve were pure and innocent and they led a peaceful life in the midst of their beautiful garden. The Lord God had given them every kind of trees for food and for pleasure. He also gave them rivers of clear refreshing waters and gold and gem stones in abundance. They were rich and at ease but the day came when the Lord took Adam aside to talk seriously to him.

*“And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, Of every tree of the garden thou mayest freely eat: but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, thou shalt not eat of it: for in the day that thou eatest thereof thou shalt surely die.” (Gen.2: 15-17)*

This was a strong admonition and a restriction that carried ominous and severe consequences. The tree of knowledge of good and evil was a very dangerous tree and it stood right in the midst of this lush orchard. The Lord told His man to stay away from this tree or else his life would change forever.

Then the Lord God proceeded with His plan and now He saw that in order to multiply this man, He must separate the woman from the man. The man is

the Spirit and life-giver and the woman is the earth and the one who forms the body of the man. The man cannot reproduce himself without the woman and the woman cannot bring to birth without the seed that is in man.

Of all the creatures that were already in the earth and that Adam gave names to, none were found to be equal to him so that his seed could multiply. So the Lord God took the woman out of the man. She is the only one who is “meet” or “up to” receiving this man's seed and reproducing his image. She is very precious indeed. She is to be the bride of the Son of God and bring up children after His image. Her children will bruise (crush) the serpent's head.

So the day came when the Lord God put His man to sleep and took the womb man out of the bosom of man. The word translated rib is the word meaning “side.” The woman is the female or womb side of the man.

She was very much a part of the man Adam but now she was separated from him and she would have to stay close and hear Him. *“Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, so let the wives be to their own husbands in everything.” (Eph.5: 24)*

### **THE INTRUDER AND USURPER THE GREAT TEMPTATION**

There came a day when the woman meandered among the trees of the garden and came to the “Tree of Knowledge of good and evil.” Was she about to be tempted, trespass the commandment of God and eat of that tree? The serpent wasted no time. He saw the weakness in Eve and He had an agenda; he quickly approached her.

Man is motivated by Spirit and also by soul which is the natural mind. Soul is “intuitive.” Intuition is the ability to know something without reasoning it out. It is a God-given inner perception or conscious understanding.

Man represents the “spirit” who hears from God. Woman represents the soul who hears from “spirit.” Both of these make up one person. When we are in

Christ there are neither male nor female for man has become one with Christ. So the soul or female side of man hears from “spirit” and as it happens God created divers kinds of spirits. The serpent was one of those and the woman listened.

When the serpent was speaking softly to allure the woman, she was fascinated. He was persuading her that if she ate of that tree she would not surely die instead she would be able to know the difference between good and evil and would no longer need God to tell her what to do. She would be as God.

The carnal mind is the area where both the tree of knowledge of good and evil and the tree of life are found. It is the area of our consciousness where all thoughts enter and are processed in order to be expressed by the body.

The voice that Eve heard was smooth and charming. She neither saw an ugly being with a pitchfork in his hand nor did she see a serpent, it was more like a gentleman friend who wanted to make her feel good and help her elevate herself in this world.

Sigmund Freud who is much too complicated for me, came up with the concept of the ID (Instinctual Drives) and the EGO and SUPER EGO as being the structure of the psyche or the mind of the soul. Ego is the “self” or the part that mediates between the demands of outer world societies and the demands for the pleasure of the inner man. I searched to find what the letters EGO stand for but no explanations were available. One came up with “Edging God Out” and I thought that was pretty much right on.

Psychologists spend their time analyzing the psyche or why people do what they do. Jesus said, *“He that findeth his life shall lose it; and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it.”* (Matt.10: 39) This word “life” that Jesus used here is from the Greek word “Psyche” from which the word psyche is derived. It is life ruled by the psyche or the natural mind.

Jesus was speaking of life which is driven by the knowledge of good and evil. This is the life of the

intellect or soul. Life which feeds on the intellect is temporary, for Jesus said when we find it, we shall lose it. But when we lose it for His sake, we shall find eternal life.

The psuche life is under the dominion of the forbidden tree. The voice of that tree are the thoughts that are projected into our minds. It is the voice of a strong, alluring, sly and cunning spirit that indwells this part of our garden (mind). He is portrayed as a serpent who speaks our language. He is very attractive to our intellect and speaks to us on any level he finds us.

The results of Eve's yielding to the serpent are written, *“And the Lord God said, Behold, the man is become as one of us, to know good and evil; and now, lest he put forth his hand, and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live for ever: therefore the Lord God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken.”* (Gen.3: 22-23)

When Adam and Eve partook of the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil they became as gods in the earth. And so the Lord God banished them from the tree of life. This means that they had entered the realm of death and could no longer hear the voice of God. This is the condition all of humanity has been plunged into ever since.

In Adam, humanity still live according to that tree. We still believe that we are gods and we arrange our lives according to the knowledge of what is good or what is bad for us. We even pray and ask God to come and fix the problems that we create from our choices. Entire societies and nations are organized and ruled by the “twisted wisdom” of the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

Furthermore, we are deceived into thinking that we have been given power over the earth. We have been taught that it is to the earthly man Adam that God had given dominion. It was not to the man of earth but to the One in His own image that God gave this dominion. Thinking himself to be God, the earthly man took it upon himself to do this work...we can but observe the results and weep.

Paul wrote to those who were once dead in trespasses and sins but have now been quickened, *"In time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of **disobedience**."* (Eph. 2: 2)

The disobedience of Adam is still the same disobedience we all find ourselves in today. We still follow the rules of the knowledge of good and evil according to our own concepts and teachings. This kind of life leads to death. *When we find ourselves in this life, we lose it, we cannot hold on to it very long.*

In our walk with the Spirit, we are learning to hear and obey the voice of the Spirit of God and to let go of our own preconceived knowledge.

### THE SAVIOR OF THE BODY

Life is Spirit. The soul and the body are the visible expression of the Spirit. Until the soul receives the Holy Spirit, the spirit of the soul comes from the breath of life of the nostrils.

When man fell into disobedience, the Lord gave him so many years to live; man was no longer immortal. The wise man wrote, *"Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was; and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it."* (Ecc.12: 7)

The Psalmist clearly explains, *"Thou hidest thy face, they are troubled: **thou takest away their breath, they die, and return to the dust.**"* (Ps.104: 29) When God takes the breath of life away, the body returns to the dust. Where is the soul? The soul is the conscious part of the body and unless it is caught up in the Spirit of God it has no place to go but to the dust. There is no such thing as 'a living soul' apart from body **and spirit**. God's Spirit is the only source of life.

It was the serpent that convinced Eve that she would not die if she ate of the tree. Man still believes that the soul apart from Spirit has life. This is the biggest deception of all. What gives life to the soul is Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God who offered Himself as a sacrifice for the sin of Adam. When a child is born into this world, the sin of Adam is at-

tached to the child. Apart from Jesus, there are no exceptions. *"For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."* (Rom.3: 23) The baby who has never done anything but cried or smiled at his mother bears the same sin as all of Adam's creation.

Apart from Jesus, the "soul" man lives in the realm of "death." *"For as in Adam all died, even so **in Christ shall all be made alive.**"* (I Cor.15: 22) This means that ALL who died in Adam, **ALL**, shall be made alive in Christ. There is no other way to interpret what Paul is saying. If it was not for Christ, there would be no way that the soul could live on anywhere after the death of this body.

The idea that a "dead soul" can hear the voice of the Lord and repent is "preposterous," it is absurd and totally foolish. The dead can no more hear the voice of God than a dead man laying in a coffin can see you and smile at you.

Jesus said, *"Verily, verily, I say unto you, The hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live."* (Jn.5:25) This can only be done by the quickening power of the Son of God. This is how we have come to hear the voice and be saved from death. This is how by this Man Christ, All shall be made alive.

*"But every man in his own order: Christ the first-fruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming. Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power. For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet. The last enemy that shall be DESTROYED is death."* (I Cor.15: 23-26)

If death is destroyed, then there is not one DEAD soul left anywhere. This is the work that has been taking place, is still taking place and will be taking place until it is fully accomplished and there is NO MORE DEATH. I believe our Father's plan is perfect and His Son is bringing it to full completion in the earth. Hallelujah!! The prophet of old called out to Zion, *"Arise, shine; for thy light is come, and the glory of **the Lord is risen upon thee.** For, be-*

hold, the darkness shall cover the earth, and gross darkness the people: but the Lord shall arise upon thee and his glory shall be seen upon thee. And **the Gentiles (heathen) shall come to thy light, and kings to the brightness of thy rising.**” (Isa. 60: 1-3)  
This is yet to be fulfilled.

These are such comforting words for us today. We have been abused and driven to exhaustion by the prince of this world and now O' Soul of mine you can rest in the peace of His Light of Life for He is the Truth and the Life. He declared, “*I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the LIGHT OF LIFE.*” (Jn.8: 12)

### IT IS STILL BY FAITH

As I awoke this morning I was pondering the words of this writing and I heard, “*It is still by faith.*” We have been on a “faith journey.” The Lord has walked us through many toils and snares to bring us to our maturity in Christ. He has shown us many wonderful truths. However, the land of Spirit is still a land that can only be seen with spiritual eyes. It can only be understood as we open our hearts to the Spirit.

The words that the Lord spoke to Abram when he was yet in his country and among his people are ever before my eyes, “*Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house,*

*unto a land that I will shew thee. And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all the nations of the earth be blessed. SO ABRAM DEPARTED.*” (Gen.12: 1-4a)

This has been the call of each one who has heard his voice. God's plan for Abram at the time was a literal land and God's plan for each son is the land of eternal life on earth as in heaven.

Did Abram, try to reason out the outcome of such a journey? “*By faith Abraham, when he was called to go out into a place which he should after receive for an inheritance, obeyed, and he went out, not knowing whither he went. By faith he sojourned in the land of promise, as in a strange country dwelling in tabernacles with Isaac and Jacob, the heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God.*” (Heb.11: 8-10)

Abraham's faith was in the Lord. He left his physical country and went to find the land that the Lord had given to him. He had absolutely no idea where this land was located or what all he would encounter on his journey.

Abraham did not hear the voice of a man standing in front of him but in his heart of hearts he knew he had heard God and he trusted and did what he had to do. It is very likely that his kindred who were staying behind questioned his sanity. They must have labeled him “Deceived.” But Abram knew what he felt within and he could not be held back by any of them.

When Paul heard the call, he did not confer with the apostles that had been before him. He went to a deserted place apart and God confirmed his calling to him. This is the same for all who hear His voice. We have heard to voice and we have followed Him into a spiritual desert. Now we listen for the sound of that last trumpet call that will bring in the manifestation of the work of incorruptibility that He has wrought within us.

We found that our lives are no longer in the lower realm of the soul. A new door has been opened within us and we hear many truths we never heard before. We have a new language and it is not just the gift of “tongues,” it is the language of Spirit. The Lord has called us out of the world we knew into a whole new world of wonders prepared for us.

We found ourselves on a wilderness journey from church to church and doctrine to doctrine. The Spirit of God was our new guide and He took us where we would not have gone before. As the refiner who dips the iron into the hot flames then plunges it into the cool waters, we found ourselves in situations we never thought possible. But He brought us through and each time we knew Him better and trusted Him more. And the voice keeps urging us... “Move on...”

Step by step we have entered into the land of Spirit. As it was with Joshua, it has been with us, “*Every place that the sole of your foot shall tread upon, that have I given unto you, as I said to Moses.*” (Josh.1: 3)

Indeed the same words were spoken to Joshua, to Moses, to Abraham and to each one of us. As soon as we walk into the land, we possess it. Move on brother.. Move on sister...By faith.

This is pretty much the story of our lives. The words we hear may seem strange at first, but as we walk in them and place our foot in that land of Spirit, we possess it. There is no other way.

Perhaps Abram's kindred tried to talk him out of going. They thought he was deceived and would die out there. But he knew what he heard. As we hear what the Spirit speaks, many thoughts come in and try to talk us out of them. But when we hear His words we cannot try to reason them out...we must go by faith and not waver.

Not long ago the Lord spoke this to me, “*A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.*” (Jms.1: 8) Indeed when we receive God's word joyfully and then have second thoughts about it, we begin to waver and we become unstable in all of our ways.

Our Lord God is our Captain. He knows our hearts and will not lead us astray. He has the map and the compass. Today's ships at sea have very sophisticated means to stay on course. Anyone who has crossed an ocean by ship knows how one could easily lose the sense of direction when day after day all one beholds are the same rolling waves with no landmark anywhere.

But of all the intricate devices that man now uses to navigate the sea of life, none are up to the degree of proficiency, skill and excellence of the Captain of our salvation. Indeed, He has shown us time and time again that we can trust Him.

The Psalmist wrote, “*God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore will not we fear, though the earth be removed, and though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea; though the waters thereof roar and be troubled, though the mountains shake with the swelling thereof. Selah.*”

*There is a river, the streams whereof shall make glad the city of God, the holy place of the tabernacles of the most High. God is in the midst of her; she shall not be moved: God shall help her, and that right early. The heathen raged, the kingdoms were moved: he uttered his voice and the earth melted.*

*The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our refuge, Selah. Come behold the works of the Lord, what desolations he hath made in the earth. He maketh wars to cease unto the end of the earth; he breaketh the bow, and cutteth the spear in sunder; he burneth the chariot in the fire. Be still and know that I am God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth.*

***THE LORD OF HOSTS IS WITH US; THE GOD OF JACOB IS OUR REFUGE. SELAH.***  
(Ps.46)

Because of His love, *Jackie Caporaso*
