Notes:

- a. Remember that a Hebrew Day begins at sunset and ends at the following sunset.
- b. Remember also that every Hebrew Month begins with the first sighting of the new moon. That makes the middle of every Hebrew month (14th/15th) a full moon. A lunar cycle is 29.5+ days, so the months are either 29 or 30 days depending upon when the new moon is sighted. But 12 lunar months are about 11 days short of a solar year, so an extra month is added usually every 3rd year (but sometimes on the 2nd year) in 19 year cycles to keep close to the solar year/seasons so that Passover can occur in the spring when lambs are available and barley begins to ripen. Interestingly, the lunar cycles match the solar years within 2 decimal points once every 40 years when a 13th month is added 7 times in 40 years, but this only works on a 360-day "prophetic" calendar year of 12 months of 30-days each. Using just "leap months", the years match within 4 decimal points (hours) at 100,000 years! Clearly this is not a random pattern and warrants further investigation.
- c. This Hebrew word is used many dozens of times and is translated variously as "set time", "time appointed", "set feasts", "appointed season", "solemn feasts", "feasts", "solemn assembly", "congregation", all of which fit Strong's definition. (See Ref. 1 & 2).
- d. Hebrew words are phonetic, so the Hebrew spellings vary between reference books, among dialects, & those commonly used today. The Hebrew spellings used on this spreadsheet are typically from Strong's, (reference 1 below)
- e. This spreadsheet was done by Eric J Ellis of <https://www.bibleconcepts.com> and ericandmaryellis@gmail.com. The scripture references given are representative, but not exhaustive in order to minimize redundancy. Please let me know if you feel any of this research is in error.
